






Overview Aiducation




Overview of your sponsored Talents

(full 4 year scholarships)


- 13 finished their first year and are now in their second year in 2025 and will finish in 2027

*There are 49 sponsored students. However, 3 of them submitted their KCSE grades but did not submit their grades for at least 1 term in 2024.


Overview of your 10 talents who graduated end 2024

Qualified for University

90% of your high school graduates have qualified for university, significantly surpassing the national average of 22%.



10 Kenyan high school students final grades (KCSE) - graduation 2024

- Top Grades (A, A-, or B+): 4 students are eligible for a free government scholarship to college
- Very good Grades (B / B- / C+): 5 students are eligible for college, but with a lower chance of receiving a scholarship


Emmanuel finished High School in 2023
